



## Ellioner Gordy Estate – Binding Administrators

On the 4<sup>th</sup> day of November 1788 William Gordy, John Gordy, and Daniel Melson are bound to the State of Maryland for one thousand pounds as administrators for the estate of Ellioner Gordy. The document lists the responsibilities of the estate administrator and the legal requirements to protect the minors (Peter and Hettie Gordy) who are involved in their mother's estate as they were in their father's, less than a year prior. William Gordy is granted letters of administration. The document is filed at the Worcester County Maryland Courthouse. No citation information is available.

Maryland *Set* Know all men by these presents that we William Gordy John Gordy  
and Daniel Nelson of Worcester County and State are tied and firmly bound unto the State of  
Maryland in the full and just sum of One Thousand pounds current money of the State afo. to  
be paid to the said State of Maryland or assigns to which payment well and truly to be made  
and done we bind ourselves and every of us our and every of our heirs Executors and Administra-  
tors in and for the whole jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our  
and dated this 11<sup>th</sup> day of November Anno Domini 1788

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the within bounden William Gordy  
Administrator of all and singular the goods Chattels and credits of Ellison Gordy late of Worcester  
County deceased do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the  
Goods Chattels and credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession  
or knowledge of him the said William Gordy or into the hands and possession of any other person or  
persons for him and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the  
Sapham Court of Worcester at or before the 11<sup>th</sup> day of February next and the same Goods  
Chattels and credits and all other the goods Chattels and credits of the said deceased at the time  
of her death which at any time after shall come to the hands or possession of the said Wm Gordy  
or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him do well and truly adminis-  
ter according to Law and shall pay the debts of the said deceased so far forth as the said Goods  
Chattels and credits shall extend and the Law will charge as also all such reasonable charges  
and fees as have arisen or shall arise or become due to any the States Officers from the said  
Wm Gordy on account of the said deceased as her Estate and further do make or cause to be made  
a true and just Account of said Administration at or before the 11<sup>th</sup> day of November next and  
all the rest and residue of the said goods Chattels and credits which shall be found remaining  
upon the said Administrators Account the same being first examined and allowed of by  
the Judge or Justices for the time being of the said Court shall deliver and pay unto the  
person or persons appointed by Law to receive the same and if it shall hereafter appear that  
any and what Testament was made by the said deceased and the Executor or Executors  
therein named do exhibit the same into the said Court on being requested to have it allow-  
ed and approved accordingly if the said Wm Gordy within bounden being thereunto  
required do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration (a probations of such  
Testament being first had and made) in the said Court then this obligation to be void  
and of none effect or else to remain in full force and virtue
